### Notice of Hearing on Petition for Repair of Ditch.

State of Minnesota, County of Anoka, ss.  
In the matter of the petition of Daniel Peebles and others for the repair of county ditch No. 53, County of Anoka.

Whereas, The engineer heretofore appointed by the County Board of Anoka county to ascertain and report the cost of repairing county ditch No. 53 in Anoka county has made and filed his report, and

Whereas, The said County Board have, by their order made and filed herein, appointed a time and place when and where they will hear and determine the said petition and report,

Now Therefore, Notice is Hereby Given, That the County Board of Anoka County will meet at the office of the County auditor of said County on the 12th day of July, 1915, at 10:30 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of determining the necessity for the repair of said ditch and to apportion and assess the cost thereof, at which time and place all persons interested are required to appear and show cause, if any there be, why such repairs should not be made, and the cost thereof apportioned and assessed to the lands benefited thereby, as by law required.

CHASE being duly sworn, on oath says: That he knows of his own knowledge that the annexed printed Notice of Hearing on Petition for Repair of Ditch hereto attached, was taken from the columns of the newspaper known as THE ANOKA HERALD, and was published in said newspaper for 3 successive weeks, first on Tuesday, the 19<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1915, and thereafter on each successive Tuesday until and including Tuesday, the 29<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1915. That during the whole time of said publication affiant was the secretary of The Anoka Herald Publishing Company, which was during said time, and still is, a corporation under the Laws of the State of Minnesota, and the proprietor, printer and publisher of said newspaper. That for more than one year prior to the commencement of said publication therein, said newspaper has been, and still is, a weekly newspaper, issued, printed and published on Tuesday of each week, in the English language, in column and sheet form, equivalent in space to more than four pages with five columns of at least seventeen and three-quarters inches length to each page, from a known office, established in such place of publication, equipped with skilled workmen and the necessary material for preparing and printing the same, and located and printed in the City of Anoka, County of Anoka and State of Minnesota, from whence it purported to be, was, and is, issued; and that during all said time it contained, and still contains, general and local news, comment and miscellany, not wholly duplicating any other publication, and not entirely made up of patents, plate matter and advertisements; and that during all said time it has been, and still is, circulated in and near its place of issue and publication to the extent of more than two hundred and forty copies, regularly delivered to paying subscribers. That on the Ninth day of August, 1911, the affidavit of R. P. Chase, Secretary of said corporation, publisher of said newspaper, was filed in the office of the County Auditor of said Anoka County, for the purpose of complying with Section 5516 of the Revised Laws, 1905.
