Auditor's Notice of Pendency of Petition.

Whereas, the owners of certain lands in the towns of Blaine and Centerville, of said Anoka county, upon the petition of Jas. T. Elwell, bearing date the 28th day of May, 1890, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch and its branches, along the route proposed therein.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their meeting in special session, at the court house, in Anoka, on the 22d day of November, 1890, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The place of commencement of said ditch and its branches, at its source, is as follows: Main ditch commencing at a point on the section line between sections 13 and 14, town 31, range 23, 649 feet south of the section corner common to sections 11, 12, 13 and 14, said town and range, thence northerly and easterly through sections 13 and 12, in town 31, range 23, and section 7, town 31, range 22, to the center of the $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 7, where it joins the Penoc ditch, "so called," thence southerly and easterly down said Penoc ditch. Also a branch known as branch "B," which commences on the section line between sections 1 and 12, town 31, range 23, 117 feet east of the nw corner of the $\frac{1}{4}$ of the $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 12, said town and range, thence southerly and westerly through section 12. Also another branch known as branch "A," commencing at the quarter post on west side of section 6, town 31, range 22, thence southerly and easterly through sections 6 and 7, said town and range.
