SALE OF DITCHING JOBS.

Notice is Hereby Given, That, on the 13th day of March 1891, at 10 o'clock A. M., at the County Auditor's Office in the city of Suoka

I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the Ditch No. 11 of Suoka County, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Suoka County, State of Minnesota, by their order bearing date January 7th 1891, viz.:

In sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the viewers in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source. The place of commencement of said ditch at its source is as follows. Commencing at or near the north east corner of the S. E. 1/4 of S. E. 1/4 of Section 2, Town 32 Range 23. Thence in a generally southerly and westerly direction through Sections 11, 14, 22, 23, and 27 said Town and Range to Leorn Creek (so called) as its outlet and there terminating.

to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said viewer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in the said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file, and may be seen at my office.
