PETITION FOR PUBLIC DITCH.

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka
State of Minnesota:

The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for, the expense of the construction of the Ditch Drain or Watercourse ^{its branch} ~~with~~ hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a construction of said Ditch Drain along the following described route in the Town of or Watercourse ^{with its branch} ~~with~~ to the public health, convenience and welfare and the same to-wit: Commencing at will be of public benefit and utility and we the undersigned hereby petition and request the said Board of County Commissioners to cause to be constructed a Ditch Drain or watercourse along the following described route in the Towns of Columbus, Ham Lake and Linwood in said County of Anoka to-wit:— Commencing on the East line of section (30) Thirty four (33) Thirty three Range (32) Twenty two about (40) forty rods south of the East Quarter $\frac{1}{4}$ part of said section, thence East in as direct a line as possible through sections (29) Twenty nine (28) Twenty eight and and terminating at (27) Twenty seven in said Town and Range to South Branch Creek (26 called) thence down said creek to the point where it crosses the county line and there terminating, also a branch ~~as its outlet~~ commencing at or near the north quarter part of section (11) Twenty one (32) Thirty two Range (33) Twenty three and thence easterly and westerly through section (6) six Town (32) Thirty two Range (32) Twenty two and sections (31) Thirty one and Thirty two (32) Town (33) Thirty three Range (32) Twenty two to intersect main line in section (29) Twenty nine said Town and Range and there terminating
