Whereas, At a session of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka State of Minnesota, held February 21st

1891, a petition signed by John Mitchell, John H. Dawson, Mrs. Lizzie Grace, G. W. Hughes, Thomas Turner, R. M. Dawson, John T. Grundy, John E. Parnell, A. J. Purmonth, S. S. Dyer, P. T. Dougherty, Edson S. Dawson, J. H. H. & L. Key, Freeman Lovelace, Jas. H. Ellwell, Howard R. Ridge, Joseph Malvada, Jas. J. Broadhead, Reuben Ridge, M. E. Dawson & John N. Howe & H. Mertz

land owners, whose lands were liable to be affected by, or assessed for, the expense of the construction of the work proposed therein, praying for the establishment and construction of a public ditch with its Branch along a route described therein, accompanied by a bond duly approved, as provided by law, was filed with the County Auditor of said County; and it appearing by proper evidence to the satisfaction of said Board of County Commissioners that at least thirty (30) days' notice has been given of the pendency of said petition and of the time at which the same would be heard, as by law provided, whereupon the said Board did, at its session on the 21st

day of February A. D. 1891, proceed to hear and determine said petition; and said Board having determined that the construction of such ditch would be of public benefit or utility, or conducive to the public health, convenience or welfare, we did accept said petition, and thereupon did appoint, as viewers of said proposed work, three (3) resident freeholders of said Anoka County, who are not interested in the construction of said

proposed work, and are not of kin to any of the parties interested therein, and directed them to meet, preparatory to commencing their duties as such viewers, at the County Auditor's Office in said County, in the City of Anoka on the 26th day of

February 1891; and it appearing to the satisfaction of said Board that certified copies of the said petition and order of said Board appointing them as said viewers was issued to and served upon said viewers, as by law provided, they proceeded, at the time set in said order, with a surveyor who is a civil engineer, and made an accurate survey of the line of said

Ditch & Branch from its source to its outlet, and did cause stakes to be placed along said line at each 100 feet, as numbered progressing down stream from its source, and made and filed a report thereof; and reported that said Ditch and Branch would be of public utility; and in their said report made the necessary computations and assessments, description of location, the land through which the same would pass, the names of the owners, and the damages or allowances thereto, the expense attending such work, and all the estimates, as required by law, duly sworn to as by law required.

And the Auditor of said Anoka County did, after the filing of said report, cause a notice to be given, to be published, posted and mailed, as by law provided, of the pendency of said petition and of the time and place set for the hearing thereof;

Now, Therefore, We, the Board of County Commissioners of said County of Anoka having met in session at the time set for the hearing of said petition, to-wit, the 6th day of June 1891, and adjourned to the _____ day of _____ 188____, and proceeded to hear the same, and having found that the report of said viewers is made according

to the provisions of law, and that the proposed Ditch and Branch will be of public utility, or conducive to public health, or of public benefit and convenience, and, from the evidence before us, that the estimated benefits of said work is greater than its total cost, including damages awarded, do hereby locate and establish the said Ditch and Branch according to the report of said viewers appointed and acting as aforesaid.

A general description, starting point, route and terminus of said proposed Ditch and Branch is as follows: Commencing at a near the northeast corner of the north west quarter of the Southwest Quarter (N.W. 1/4 S.W. 1/4) of section Three (3) Town Thirty three (33) Range Twenty three (23) Thence in a southerly and easterly direction through section Three (3) said Town and Range to Grass Lake, so called, Thence southerly and westerly to the outlet of said Grass Lake through sections Three (3) & Ten (10) said Town and Range and down said outlet of Grass Lake to Deer Lake so called in section Fifteen (15) said Town and Range. Thence southerly and westerly through said Deer Lake through section Fifteen (15) said Town & Range to the south side of said Lake, Thence southerly and westerly through sections Twenty one (21) and Twenty (20) to Crooked Brook so called where said Brook crosses the north line of the South east quarter of the South east quarter (S.E. 1/4 S.E. 1/4) of said section Twenty (20) and thence down said Crooked Brook through sections (20) Twenty (29) Twenty nine & Thirty (30) & where the State Road crosses said Crooked Brook and there terminating for the main line. Also a branch line commencing at a near the section corner common to sections Four (4) Five (5) Eight (8) and Nine (9) Town Thirty three (33) Range 23 Twenty three, Thence southerly and easterly through said sections Eight (8) and Nine (9) into Red Lake so called, across said Red Lake to Mud Lake, so called, in section Sixteen (16) said Town and

Range and thence through said Mud Lake and across sections Sixteen (16) Twenty one (21) and Twenty (20) said Town and Range into Crooked Brook and thence down said Brook to join the main line in the South East quarter of said section Twenty (20)
