Dear Sir:-

We wish to examine into the proceedings in the matter of repairs to County Ditch #15, in the County of Anoka, Minnesota, and we should like to have you furnish us with some information regarding the same, accordingly.

Will you kindly let us know upon whose petition these proceedings were instituted and the date of the filing of the petition, also whether we are right in our assumption that these proceedings were taken under Chapter 44 of the Revised Laws of 1905 and not under Chapter 448 of the Laws of 1907.

Will you also kindly give us the date of the preliminary hearing on this matter by the County Board and the date of the final hearing and order, fixing the assessment. If you have the information also at hand, will you inform us why there was omitted from the assessment of benefits in this proceeding the forty acres owned by Abraham Perry, being the Southeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Sec. 36, T. 32, R. 23 and the eighty acres of Louis Dupre, being the North half of the Northwest quarter of said Section 36. Will you also kindly give us the names of the viewers, who acted in said proceeding.

This is perhaps quite a large demand to make upon a busy office, but we wish to investigate this proceeding and it is impossible just at the present time for us to visit Anoka and examine the records in person.

I shall appreciate very much the courtesy if you can forward us this information by an early mail.
