newspaper was printed and published in the City of Anoka, in the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota, on Friday of each week; that during all said time said newspaper has been printed in the English language from its known office of publication within the city from which it purports to be issued as above stated and in newspaper format and in column and sheet form equivalent in space to at least 450 running inches of single column, two inches wide; has been issued once each week from a known office established in said place of publication and employing skilled workmen and the necessary material for preparing and printing the same; that the press work on that part of the newspaper devoted to local news of interest to the community it purports to serve has been done in its known office of publication; that during all said time in its makeup not less than twenty-five percent of its news columns have been devoted to local news of interest to the community it purports to serve; that during all said time it has not wholly duplicated any other publication, and has not been entirely made up of patents, plate matter and advertisements; has been circulated in and near its said place of publication to the extent of at least two hundred and forty (240) copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers and has entry as second class matter in its local post office; that there has been on file in the office of the County Auditor of Anoka County, Minnesota, the affidavit of a person having knowledge of the facts, showing the name and location of said newspaper and the existence of the conditions constituting its qualifications as a legal newspaper; and that a copy of each issue has been filed with the State Historical Society.

PETITION OF CITY OF BLAINE FOR THE RIGHT TO DISCHARGE STORM RUN-OFF INTO COUNTY DITCH NUMBER 17 IN ANOKA COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN COUNTY DITCH NUMBER 17 IN ANOKA COUNTY:

YOU AND EACH OF YOU, WILL PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, that the City of Blaine in the County of Anoka, Minnesota, has filed a petition with the County Auditor of Anoka County, Minnesota, pursuant to M.S.A. 106.531, praying that the City of Blaine be allowed to discharge storm run-off into County Ditch Number 17, which runs through Sections 29, 30, 31 and 32 in the City of Blaine, and Section 36 in the City of Coon Rapids and Section 3 in the City of Fridley, and that said petition alleges that it is advantageous and desirable to grant this discharge storm run-off into County Ditch Number 17.

YOU WILL FURTHER TAKE NOTICE, that a hearing will be held by the County Board of Commissioners, on said petition, in the Commissioners' Room, in the Court House in the City of Anoka, Minnesota, on the 24th day of August, 1965, at 11 o'clock A.M., at which time all persons interested in said ditch system may appear and be heard, and present arguments for or against the granting of said petition.
