and being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been one of the managers and printers of The Anoka Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Anoka, in said Anoka County on Tuesday of each week. Auditor's Notice of Hearing on Repairs Co. Ditch No. 18.

In the matter of the complaint of Mary E. Bolstridge, concerning the condition of county ditch No. 18 on the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota.

Notice is hereby given that, whereas, a complaint has been filed in the office of the county auditor of said county, stating that county ditch No. 18 is out of repair, is obstructed, is too shallow and too narrow to answer its purpose, and notifying the board of county commissioners to open, widen and deepen said ditch and free the same from obstructions, so that it will answer its purpose, and the civil engineer appointed by the board of county commissioners of said county to make an examination of said ditch has completed his work and made due report thereof and filed said report in the office of county auditor of said county; which ditch as specified and established by the order of the county commissioners dated March 11th, 1893, commences near the southwest corner of the nw¹/₄ of the nw¹/₄ of section 27, town 34, range 24, as its source, and running thence southerly through the n¹/₂ of sw¹/₄ of said section 27, through the e¹/₂ of the se¹/₄ of section 28 through the e¹/₂ of section 33, T. 34, R. 24, thence southwesterly through section 4 and through the se¹/₄ of section 5, T. 33, R. 24, and terminating in Rum river in said Sec. 5 as its outlet; which said ditch, as appears from said order, passes through certain lands and affects certain roads, railroads, municipal corporations and other corporations, the description of which lands, roads and railroads and the names of the owners thereof and of the municipal and other corporations so affected are as follows: Chas. That, therefore, the board of county commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota, will hold a special meeting on Tuesday, the 23rd day of November, A. D. 1909, at 10:30 o'clock in the forenoon of said day at the auditor's office in the court house in the City of Anoka, in said County of Anoka, for hearing on and consideration of said complaint and notice, said engineer's report, the determination of whether or not said ditch shall be repaired, widened, deepened and freed from obstructions, and to assess the cost of said work; and that at said time and place all persons interested in the repairs of said ditch are invited and requested to appear and be heard both for and against the same.

As much of this land has been subdivided since the original ditch was established, it is earnestly requested that all parties interested be present to assist the commissioners in the division of the benefits assessed against these lands. The engineer has also filed two estimates and profiles, showing that the ditch when completely repaired according to the first plan will cost approximately \$500, and according to the second plan approximately \$900.
