This Contract, Made this 6th day of May, 1893, by and between E. P. Woodworth of Anoka Co., party of the first part, and G. W. Putnam County Auditor of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota, in behalf of Anoka County, Minnesota, WITNESSETH:

Whereas, The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka State of Minnesota, did establish and order to be constructed a certain Ditch designated as No. 19 which number has been given to said Ditch by the County Auditor

by their order, bearing date the 11th day of March, 1893, and according to the report of the viewers thereof, all of which are on file in the office of the said County Auditor;

And Whereas, At a public sale of the jobs of digging and constructing the entire work in linear sections of 100 feet each, each of which sections is marked and known and numbered by the stake set by said viewers at the foot of each of said sections, as shown by the viewers' report, commencing at the one including the outlet, and thence, in succession, to the one including the source, held May 6, 1893, the said G. W. Putnam County Auditor, as aforesaid, did duly sell to the said E. P. Woodworth he being the highest and best responsible bidder, the job of digging and constructing the following sections thereof, numbered as follows from said outlet, to-wit: Sta. 339, 313, 310, 311, 249 to 206 inc, 204, 197 to 175 inc (139 to 91 inc) in Main Ditch; (+60 + 106 to 75 inc); (60, 61, + 62) Branch No. 1; 22 + 20 to 0 inc in Branch No. 2 at the respective prices amounting in the aggregate to Four Hundred Sixty One + 3/10 of dollars (and also two bridges, one at sta 124 Main Ditch for 13.00 and one at Sta 61 Branch 1 for Ten Dollars
