SALE OF DITCHING JOBS.

Notice is hereby given, that, on the Second day of May, 1889, at 10 o'clock a. m., at the County Auditor's office, in the city of Anoka, I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the Ditch No. 2 (known as Heglund ditch), of Anoka county, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka county, state of Minnesota, by their order bearing date March 4th, 1889, viz: In sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the viewers in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source. The main line of said ditch commences in section 8, town 32, range 23, and runs thence through sections 7, 17, 18, 19, and ends in Coon Creek, in section 30, said town and range, and the branch to the same commences in section 13, town 32, range 24, and runs thence into the southwest quarter of section 18, town 32, range 23, where it joins the said main line of said ditch, to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said viewer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in the said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract.
