Whereas, A petition bearing date the 10th day of September
1892, signed by Peter Brant, Andrew Peterson,
Lester Paakson, Adolph Bucholz,
Joseph Herrman and John Okelha
praying for the establishment of a certain Ditch in said County, the
route of which is more fully described in said petition, and a proper bond accompanying the same,
have been filed with the County Auditor of said County, as by law required;

And Whereas, It appears, by satisfactory proof to the Board of County Commissioners of
Anoka County, that at least thirty (30) days' notice of the pendency
of said petition, and the time and place at which the same would be heard, has been given as
required by law;

And Whereas, Said Board has determined that the construction of such ditch as proposed
in said petition will be of public benefit or utility, or conducive to the public health, convenience or
welfare;

Now, Therefore, We, the Board of County Commissioners of said County, at a ^{Special} ~~regular~~
session held this day, do hereby accept said petition, do hereby appoint L. W. Hatch
John Hunter and Thomas A. Preston
three resident freeholders of said County, and not interested in the construction of said proposed
work, and not of kin to any parties interested therein, as viewers, and do specify the 10th
day of December 1892, at the County Auditor's Office in the
City of Anoka at 10 o'clock A.M. as the time and place for said viewers to meet,
preparatory to commencing their duties as such viewers, as prescribed by law, and after completing
their duties as such viewers to make and file their report with the County Auditor of said County,
on or before the first day of February 1893
