Came personally before me Granville S. Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday

SALE OF DITCHING JOBS.

Notice is hereby given, that, on the 10th day of March, 1894, at 11 o'clock, a. m., at the County Auditor's office in the City of Anoka, County of Anoka and State of Minnesota, I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the Ditch No. 21 of Anoka County, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka County, State of Minnesota, by their order bearing date January 3rd, 1894, viz.: In sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the viewers in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source. Said ditch commencing at the Northwest corner of the $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$ of $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 6, in Township 32, in Range 23, thence running in a Northwesterly course through said Sec. 6 to the East line of Sec. 1, in Township 32 and Range 24, in the said County of Anoka, thence westerly through the North half of said Sec. one (1) to the East line of Sec. 2, in said Township 32 and Range 24, thence Southwesterly through said Sec. 2, to a point on the West line of said Sec. 2, where Clark's Brook (so called) crosses said Sec. line, thence down Clark's Brook in a Northwesterly and Northerly course through the $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 3, Township 32 and Range 24, and terminating at Station or Section 285 in Clark's Brook (so called) in the $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 3, Town 32, Range 24, as its outlet, to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said viewer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in the said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file, and may be seen at my office.
