by and between E. P. Woodworth of Aurika Co., party of the first part, and W. M. Putnam County Auditor of the County of Aurika, State of Minnesota, in behalf of Aurika County, Minnesota, WITNESSETH:

Whereas, The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Aurika State of Minnesota, did establish and order to be constructed a certain Ditch designated as No. 22 which number has been given to said Ditch by the County Auditor

by their order, bearing date the 3rd day of March, 1894, and according to the report of the viewers thereof, all of which are on file in the office of the said County Auditor;

And Whereas, At a public sale of the jobs of digging and constructing the entire work in linear sections of 100 feet each, each of which sections is marked and known and numbered by the stake set by said viewers at the foot of each of said sections, as shown by the viewers' report, commencing at the one including the outlet, and thence, in succession, to the one including the source, held March 3, 1894, the said E. P. Woodworth County Auditor, as aforesaid, did duly sell to the said E. P. Woodworth he being the ~~highest~~ ^{lowest} and best responsible bidder, the job of digging and constructing the following sections thereof, numbered as follows from said outlet, to-wit: the 22, 24, 25, 27 & 30 sec. 16 to 58 sec. 1, lot 6 to 7 & 2 sec. 7, 5, 7, 7, 8, 1, 8, 2, 5, 3, 9, 1, 9, 5, 9, 6, 9, 7, 9, 9 at that rate per acre, to-wit: 100 dollars for the aggregate to thirty eight & 72 dollars for the ridge for beam & 80 dollars making a total of 100 dollars & 52 dollars 100
