Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday of each week.

AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDING OF PETITION.

Whereas, the owners of certain lands in the towns of Anoka, Grow and Ham Lake of said Anoka county, upon the petition of C. D. Tuthill, Peter Olson, John P. Swanson, Erick Johnson, Jules Boxwell, Peter Swenson, Andrew Olson and A. Hawkins bearing date the 15th day of June, 1894 and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein,

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their meeting, in regular session at the court house, in the city of Anoka, on the 8th day of January, 1895, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The place of commencement of said ditch at its source is as follows: Commencing at or near the center of the $\frac{se}{4}$ of $\frac{ne}{2}$ of section 1, town 31, range 24; thence northwesterly through the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 1, to the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of section 30, town 32, range 24; thence northeasterly through the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 30, into section 31, town 32, range 23; thence in a northerly course through the west $\frac{1}{2}$ of said section 31, into the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of $\frac{sw}{4}$ of section 30, town 32, range 23.

The names of the persons through whose lands the proposed ditch passes are as follows: Edward Brooks, Greenwald & Niles, Elizabeth L. Bradley, G. W. Murrell, A. Hawkins, Foster R. Clement.

The place of termination of said ditch at its outlet is as follows: Terminating at a point in Coon Creek (so called) in the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of $\frac{sw}{4}$ of said section 30, 40 rods east of the west line of said $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of $\frac{sw}{4}$ of said section 30, to be known as Ditch No. 23.

The names of the owners of the lands that will be affected thereby are Edward Brooks, Peter Olson, C. D. Tuthill, A. V. Shotwell, Eric Johnson, Greenwald & Niles, Peter Swenson, Elizabeth L. Bradley, Jacob Egler, G. W. Murrell, Edward Stack, A. Hawkins.

That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of Auditor's Notice of Pendency of Petition hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for three successive weeks, and that all said publications were made in the English language.
