Whereas, the owners of certain lands in the town of Blaine, of said Anoka county, upon the petition of Jas. T. Elwell, Daniel Peebles, M. V. B. Phillips, Andrew Frieschman, John Flor, Mike Flor, Mike Liebel, R. Van Elsberg, William Traverse and Fred. Wenzel, bearing date the 3rd day of July, 1894, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein,

Now, therefore, notice is hereby of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their meeting in regular session at the court house, in the city of Anoka, on the 8th day of January, 1895, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The place of commencement of said ditch at its source is as follows: Commencing at a near the south east corner of the north east quarter of section 14, town 31, range 23, thence running southerly and through any part of sections 14, 15, 23, 24, 26 and 25 that may be necessary.

The names of the persons through whose lands the proposed ditch passes are as follows: Foster R. Clement, Fred. Wenzel, Mike Flor and Cornelius Linehan.

The place of termination of said ditch at its outlet is as follows: In what is known as Sandy or Golden lake, in lot 2, in section 25, town 31, range 23, in the northern portion of said lake at or near the south east corner of said lot 2, to be known as Ditch No. 24.

That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of Qualifications of Persons of Petitioners hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for three successive weeks, and that all said publications were made in the English language.
