Whereas, a petition signed by J. L. Fitch and
others, bearing date the 15th day of July, 1915, a
true copy of which follows below, praying for the
repairs of County Ditch No. 25, has been filed in

the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka
County at its special session to be held at the
auditor's office in the City of Anoka, county afore-
said, on Tuesday the 31st day of August, A. D.
1915, at 10:30 o'clock a. m.

COPY OF PETITION.

To the County Board of Anoka County, Minne-
sota: The undersigned petitioners respectfully
represent and state: That they are the owners
of lands that have been heretofore assessed for
the construction of County Ditch No. 25 of Anoka
County; That said ditch is in need of repairs and
that its usefulness for the purpose for which it
was constructed has become greatly impaired by
reason of the following facts: That said ditch
has become obstructed by the deposit of sediment
therein and by the growth of weeds and grasses
upon and along the bottom, sides, banks and
right of way thereof; that by reason of the con-
struction of side and lateral ditches emptying
into said ditch the volume of water to be taken
care of by said county ditch No. 25 has been in-
creased beyond the capacity thereof. Wherefore
your petitioners pray that you will appoint a
civil engineer to ascertain and report to you the
necessity thereof, and the cost of making such
repairs, and when such report is filed such
other and further proceedings may be had as may
be necessary for the repair of said ditch.

his own knowledge that the annexed printed Notice of
Pendency of Petition
hereto attached, was taken from the columns of the newspaper
known as THE ANOKA HERALD, and was published in said news-

and located and printed in the City of Anoka, County of Anoka and
State of Minnesota, from whence it purported to be, was and is, is-
sued; and that during all said time it contained, and still contains,
general and local news, comment and miscellany, not wholly dupli-
cating any other publication, and not entirely made up of patents,
plate matter and advertisements, and that during all said time it has
been, and still is, circulated in and near its place of issue and publi-
cation to the extent of more than two hundred and forty copies,
regularly delivered to paying subscribers. That on the Ninth day of
August, 1911, the affidavit of R. P. Chase, Secretary of said corpora-
tion, publisher of said newspaper, was filed in the office of the
County Auditor of said Anoka County, for the purpose of complying
with Section 5516 of the Revised Laws, 1905.
