PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, }

Came personally before me Granville S. Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday

day of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that

the printed notice of Safe of

hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each

week for three successive weeks, and that all

said publications were made in the English language. That said notice was first inserted, printed and published in said

newspaper on Wednesday, the 14th day of

August, 1893, and was printed and

published therein on each and every Wednesday thereafter until

and including Wednesday, the 4th day of Sept,

1893; that during all the time aforesaid said newspaper

was a collection of general and local news, comments and miscellaneous literary items, and regularly issued and published

on Wednesday of each week from a known office of publication, said office being equipped with the necessary materials,

including press, and skilled workmen for producing the same, and has consisted of not less than four pages, of more than

five columns to the page, each column not less than seventeen

and three-fourths inches in length, and never made up wholly

of patents, plates and advertisements, or either or any of them, and has not been substantially a duplicate of any other newspaper,

and has been regularly delivered each week to more than two-hundred and forty paid subscribers, and that said

newspaper, composed and consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the English language weekly, and

generally circulated in Anoka county for more than one year next preceding the date of the first publication of said notice.

That the publisher of said newspaper on the 3rd day of May, 1893, filed with the County Auditor of said Anoka County, an affidavit setting forth the facts required by Section 2, of Chapter 33, of the laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1893.

Sale of Ditching Jobs.

Notice is hereby given, That, on the 7th day of September, 1893, at 11 o'clock a. m., at the County Auditor's office in the City of Anoka, County of Anoka and State of Minnesota, I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the Ditch No. 25 of Anoka County, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka County, State of Minnesota, by their order bearing date July 8th, 1893, viz.: In sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the viewers in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source. Said ditch commencing at the $\frac{3}{4}$ post next north of the south $\frac{1}{4}$ post of Section Thirty-two (32), Town 91, Range 22, thence running easterly and northeasterly through said sections 32 and 33, 28, 21, and 22 said Town and Range and terminating in Centerville Lake so called at or near the center of the shore line of Lot 3, in said Sec. 22 as its outlet, also a branch commencing in the center of the Northwest Quarter of Section 34, of said Town and Range, thence running south-westerly and westerly through said Section 34, and east half of Section 33, to connect with main ditch in the nw $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 33 and near the center of said nw $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Sec. 33, to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said viewer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in the said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file, and may be seen at my office.
