# PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, }  
 COUNTY OF ANOKA. } ss.

Came personally before me Granville S. Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday

of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of an auditors notice of pendency of petition hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for four successive weeks, and that all said publications were made in the English language. That said notice was first inserted, printed and published in said newspaper on Wednesday, the 11<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1895, and was printed and published therein on each and every Wednesday thereafter until and including Wednesday, the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 1896; that during all the time aforesaid said newspaper was a collection of general and local news, comments and miscellaneous literary items, and regularly issued and published on Wednesday of each week from a known office of publication, said office being equipped with the necessary materials, including press, and skilled workmen for producing the same, and has consisted of not less than four pages, of more than five columns to the page, each column not less than seventeen and three-fourths inches in length, and never made up wholly of patents, plates and advertisements, or either or any of them, and has not been substantially a duplicate of any other newspaper, and has been regularly delivered each week to more than two-hundred and forty paid subscribers, and that said newspaper, composed and consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the English language weekly, and generally circulated in Anoka county for more than one year next preceding the date of the first publication of said notice. That the publisher of said newspaper on the 3rd day of May, 1893, filed with the County Auditor of said Anoka County, an affidavit setting forth the facts required by Section 2, of Chapter 33, of the laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1893.

**AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDING OF PETITION.**

Whereas, the owners of certain lands in the towns of Blaine and Anoka of said Anoka county, upon the petition of W. J. Pope, J. B. Meister, B. T. Pope, Henry Lee, Ole L. Miller, M. J. Kelly and E. H. Robinson, bearing date the 15 day of July, 1895, and on file in my office, pray for the establishment of a public ditch along route proposed therein.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of pendency of said petition, and that the same be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their next regular session at the Court House, in the City of Anoka, on the seventh day of January, 1896, o'clock, a. m.

The place of commencement of said ditch its source is as follows: Commencing on the  $\frac{1}{2}$  line running east and west and 15 rods west of the  $\frac{1}{2}$  line running north and south in the  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of section 4, Town 31, Range 23; thence westerly through  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 4, and  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 5, and southwesterly through  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 5, and westerly through  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 8, and  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 5, and westerly through  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 6, and southwesterly through  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 6, southerly and westerly through the  $\text{w}\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 7, all in town 31, Range 23, to the town line between the towns of Anoka and Blaine and westerly in Section 12, Town 31, Range 24 to intersect Sand Creek, so called; thence down said creek to a point about 20 rods west of the bridge across Sand Creek in said Section 12, as its outlet. Also a Branch commencing about 25 rods south of the  $\frac{1}{2}$  line running east and west through the  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 7, and at section line between Sections 7 and 8; thence westerly to intersect the main ditch in the  $\text{e}\frac{1}{2}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 7 in Town 31, Range 23, as its outlet. Ditch given the number of 26.

The names of the persons through whose lands the proposed ditch passes are as follows: Sherman Self and others, Richard Rickaby, Ole L. Miller, Hannah Martin, W. E. Holmes, A. E. Rickaby, Johnson and Parker, Chas. Allen, Commercial Bank of Minneapolis, John H. Weisner and J. B. Meister.

The place of termination of said ditch and branch at its outlet is as follows: Main ditch in Section 12 in Town 31, Range 24 in Sand Creek, so called, at a point 20 rods west of the bridge across said Sand Creek in said Section 12.

Branch ditch intersecting Main ditch in the  $\text{e}\frac{1}{2}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 7, in Town 31, Range 23, as its outlet.
