Whereas, At a session of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka State of Minnesota, held October 27 1887, a petition signed by Geo L Parkbury, P. Nickerson, F O Sverkerson & Rupprecht, Carl Voight, Chas Miller & Chas Hauck, Peter Dan, C. E. Rohr, Erick Olson, Peter Johnson, J. F. Perkins, John Leinen, D. M. Gamaret, J. G. Goldman, J. T. Keen, John Moes, Louis Meier, Peter Weller, land owners, whose lands were liable to be affected by, or assessed for, the expense of the construction of the work proposed therein, praying for the establishment and construction of a public Ditch along a route described therein, accompanied by a bond duly approved, as provided by law, was filed with the County Auditor of said County; and it appearing by proper evidence to the satisfaction of said Board of County Commissioners that at least thirty (30) days' notice has been given of the pendency of said petition and of the time at which the same would be heard, as by law provided, whereupon the said Board did, at its session on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October A. D. 1887, proceed to hear and determine said petition; and said Board having determined that the construction of such ditch would be of public benefit or utility, or conducive to the public health, convenience or welfare, we did accept said petition, and thereupon did appoint, as viewers of said proposed work, three (3) resident freeholders of said Anoka County, who are not interested in the construction of said proposed work, and are not of kin to any of the parties interested therein, and directed them to meet, preparatory to commencing their duties as such viewers, at Co. Auditor's Office in said County, at 1 o'clock P.M. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November 1887; and it appearing to the satisfaction of said Board that certified copies of the said petition and order of said Board appointing them as said viewers was issued to and served upon said viewers, as by law provided, they proceeded, at the time set in said order, with a surveyor who is a civil engineer, and made an accurate survey of the line of said Ditch from its source to its outlet, and did cause stakes to be placed along said line at each 100 feet, as numbered progressing down stream from its source, and made and filed a report thereof; and reported that said Ditch would be of public utility; and in their said report made the necessary computations and assessments, description of location, the land through which the same would pass, the names of the owners, and the damages or allowances thereto, the expense attending such work, and all the estimates, as required by law, duly sworn to as by law required.

And the Auditor of said Anoka County did, after the filing of said report, cause a notice to be given, to be published, posted and mailed, as by law provided, of the pendency of said petition and of the time and place set for the hearing thereof;

Now, Therefore, We, the Board of County Commissioners of said County of Anoka, having met in session at the time set for the hearing of said petition, to-wit, the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March 1888, and adjourned to the day of 1888, and proceeded to hear the same, and having found that the report of said viewers is made according

to the provisions of law, and that the proposed Ditch to be of public utility, or conducive to public health, or of public benefit and convenience, and, from the evidence before us, that the estimated benefits of said work is greater than its total cost, including damages awarded, do hereby locate and establish the said Ditch according to the report of said viewers appointed and acting as aforesaid.

A general description, starting point, route and terminus of said proposed Ditch is as follows: Commencing about 20 rods North of South East corner of  $\frac{SE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{SE}{4}$  Section 19 Town 33 Range 28, whence through  $\frac{NE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{NE}{4}$  Sec 30, thence South-Easterly through Sec 29 as  $\frac{NE}{4}$  Sec 32 as  $\frac{SE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{SE}{4}$  Sec 33 whence South-westerly through  $\frac{NE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{SE}{4}$  Sec 33,  $\frac{SE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{SE}{4}$  Sec 32, th- Southeast, through  $\frac{SE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{SE}{4}$  of Sec 32 Town 33 Range 28, thence through  $\frac{SE}{4}$  Section 8-Town 32 Range 28 through Sections 8-4 & 3 Town 32 Range 28 and terminates in Scott Brook so called in Section 10, and the following Branches, to-wit:

Branch No. 1- Commencing  $\frac{NE}{4}$  of  $\frac{NE}{4}$  Sec 29 Town 33 Range 28 as running through  $\frac{SE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{SE}{4}$  Sec 29 Town 33 Range 28 terminates in main Ditch about rods N. of S.E. cor. of Sec. 19 Town 33 Range 28-

Branch No. 2- Com.  $\frac{SE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{NE}{4}$  Sec 29 T. 33 R. 28- as running through the middle of Sec 29 and South on  $\frac{1}{4}$  line about 40 rods. thence South-Westerly and terminates in main Ditch near the center  $\frac{NE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{SE}{4}$  Sec 29 Town 33 Range 28

Branch No. 3- Com. on the cor. of  $\frac{NE}{4}$  of Sec 4 T. 33 R. 28 thence South-westerly through  $\frac{NE}{4}$  Sec 4 & terminates in main Ditch in the middle of  $\frac{SE}{4}$ ,  $\frac{NE}{4}$  Sec 4 Town 32 Range 28 on the eighth line.
