# PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, }  
 COUNTY OF ANOKA. } ss.

Came personally before me Granville S. Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday of each week.

That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of Salary of Dilator

hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for three successive weeks, and that all said publications were made in the English language. That said notice was first inserted, printed and published in said newspaper on Wednesday, the 9<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1898, and was printed and published therein on each and every Wednesday thereafter until and including Wednesday, the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of November, 1898;

that during all the time aforesaid said newspaper was a collection of general and local news, comments and miscellaneous literary items, and regularly issued and published on Wednesday of each week from a known office of publication, said office being equipped with the necessary materials, including press, and skilled workmen for producing the same, and has consisted of not less than four pages, of more than five columns to the page, each column not less than seventeen and three-fourths inches in length, and never made up wholly of patents, plates and advertisements, or either or any of them, and has not been substantially a duplicate of any other newspaper, and has been regularly delivered each week to more than two-hundred and forty paid subscribers, and that said newspaper, composed and consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the English language weekly, and generally circulated in Anoka county for more than one year next preceding the date of the first publication of said notice.

That the publisher of said newspaper on the 3rd day of May, 1893, filed with the County Auditor of said Anoka County, an affidavit setting forth the facts required by Section 2, of Chapter 33, of the laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1893.

## (First publication November 9th, 1898.) Sale of Ditching Jobs.

Notice is hereby given, that, on the 3rd day of December, 1898, at 11 o'clock a. m., at the County Auditor's office, in the city of Anoka, I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the Ditch No. 27 of Anoka county, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka county, state of Minnesota, by their order bearing date March 12th, 1898, viz: In sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the viewers in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source from Section 0 to Section 369 plus 20 Main line, through  $\frac{se}{4}$  of  $\frac{se}{4}$  of Section 19, through Section 30, Section 29 and Section 32, all in Town 33, Range 25, also through Sections 5, 4 and 3, in Town 32, Range 25, and terminating in Trot Brook, in Section 10, Town 32, Range 25. Branch No. 1 in Sections 29 and 20, Town 33, Range 25. Branch No. 2 in Section 29, Town 33, Range 25. Branch No. 3 in  $\frac{nw}{4}$  of Section 4, Town 32, Range 25 to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said viewer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract.
