Whereas, The owners of certain lands in the Towns of Ramsey and Burns of said Anoka county, upon the petition of Geo. L. Rathbun, J. F. Wickstrom, F. O. Sverkerson, H. Rupprecht, Carl Voigt, Chas. Herring bearing date the 8th day of September, 1897, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein.

The place of commencement of said ditch at its source is as follows: Commencing about 20 rods North of South East corner of se ¼ of section 19, Town 33, Range 25; thence through ne ¼ of ne ¼, section 30, thence south easterly through sections 29 and 32, Town 33, Range 25; thence through nw ¼, section 5, Town 32, Range 25, through sections 5, 4, and 3, Town 32, Range 25 and terminate in Trott Brook (so called) in section 3, with such branches as may be necessary.
