AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF PETITION.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, COUNTY OF ANOKA—ss.

Whereas the owners of certain lands in the Towns of Ham Lake and Bethel of said Anoka county, upon the petition of L. J. Anderson, bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1897, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein,

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their special session at the court house, in the city of Anoka, on the 2nd day of May, 1898, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The place of commencement of said ditch at its source is as follows: Commencing about 20 rods east of the center of Section 5, Town 32, Range 23, and thence in a generally northerly direction through said Section 5 and Sections 32 and 29, Town 32, Range 23, to Crooked Brook, so called, near the center of said Section 29, as its outlet, with such branch ditch or ditches as the surveyors may deem necessary to give the lands assessed for the construction of said ditch the full benefit thereof.

PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

Came personally before me *L. W. Russell*

and being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the manager and printer of *The Anoka Herald*, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Friday of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed
