The condition of this obligation is such, that Whereas the above bounden Edward Anderson & J. W. Johnson and others have filed a petition with the County Auditor of Anoka County, State of Minnesota, praying for the establishment and construction of Repairs of County Ditch Number Twenty-eight (28) of said County, and for the opening, widening, deepening, straightening and repairing of the same;

NOW THEREFORE, If the said Edward Anderson & J. W. Johnson shall pay to the County all costs and expenses which may be incurred in case the proceedings are for any reason dismissed or said proposed repairs are not finally ordered or established, or for any reason no contract is entered into for the said repairs, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

This organization shall be known as the Union Co. Peace Commission. It shall be organized for the purpose of maintaining peace and order in the County of Union, Minnesota. The Commission shall consist of five members, to be appointed by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Union, Minnesota.

The Commission shall have the honor and authority of the County of Union, Minnesota, and shall be empowered to do all such things as may be necessary to carry out its duties. The Commission shall have the right to call upon the County of Union, Minnesota, for such assistance as may be required.

The Commission shall be organized on the 1st day of October, 1919, and shall continue in existence until the 31st day of September, 1920.

The Commission shall have the honor and authority of the County of Union, Minnesota, and shall be empowered to do all such things as may be necessary to carry out its duties. The Commission shall have the right to call upon the County of Union, Minnesota, for such assistance as may be required.
