Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday of each week.

## Sale of Ditching Jobs.

**NOTICE OF SALE IN DITCH PROCEEDINGS.**

Notice is hereby given, that, on the 10th day of September, 1898, at 10 o'clock a. m., at the County Auditor's office in the City of Anoka, I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the Ditch No. 30 of Anoka county, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka county, State of Minnesota, by their order bearing date July 11, 1898, viz.: In sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the viewers in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source. The Main line of said ditch commences about thirty (30) rods east of the center of the nw $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 1, Town 33, Range 25; thence in a general northwesterly direction through the nw $\frac{1}{4}$  of said Sec. 1, and the sw $\frac{1}{4}$  of sw $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 38, and e $\frac{1}{2}$  of se $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 35, Town 34, Range 25, to Seelye Brook (so called) as its outlet.

Also a Branch commencing about ten rods east of the ne corner of the nw $\frac{1}{4}$  of ne $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 2, T. 33, R. 25; thence southeasterly about 45 rods; thence northeasterly through ne $\frac{1}{4}$  of ne $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 2, T. 33, R. 25, and se $\frac{1}{4}$  of se $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 35, T. 34, R. 25, to Main Ditch, as its outlet; to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said viewer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in the said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file, and may be seen at my office.
