PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

Came personally before me Granville S. Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that

AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF
 Petition, State of Minnesota, County of Anoka, ss.

Whereas, the viewers appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of said county of Anoka, at their session held on the 12th day of March, 1898, upon the petition of James McDonald, Andrew Mattson, John H. McDonald, and others, bearing date the 24th day of January, 1898, and on file in my office praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, have made their report and filed the same in my office.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their session to be held at Court House in the city of Anoka in said county, on the 11th day of July, 1898, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The place of commencement of said ditch at its source is as follows: Commencing about thirty (30) rods east of the center of the nw¹/₄ of section 1, town 33, range 25; thence in a general northwesterly direction through the nw¹/₄ of said section 1 and the sw¹/₄ of section 36, town 34, range 25, and the se¹/₄ of section 35, said town and range, to Seelye Brook (so-called), as its outlet.

Also a branch commencing about 10 rods east of the ne corner of the nw¹/₄ of ne¹/₄ of section 2, town 33, range 25; thence southeasterly about 45 rods; thence northeasterly through ne¹/₄ ne¹/₄ section 2, town 33, range 25 and se¹/₄ of se¹/₄ of section 35, town 34, range 25, to main ditch.

The names of the persons through whose lands the proposed ditch passes are as follows: St. P. M. & M. Ry. Co., John H. McDonald, Iver K. Dahl, S. R. Thayer, John McDonald.

The place of termination of said ditch at its outlet is as follows: Main ditch in Seelye Brook (so-called), in north part of the ne¹/₄ of se¹/₄ section 35, town 34, range 25.

Branch line in main ditch in se¹/₄ of se¹/₄ section 35, town 34, range 25.

The names of the owners of the lands that will be affected thereby as shown by the latest tax duplicates of said county, are: St. P. M. & M. R. Co., Jas. McDonald, S. R. Thayer, Francis A. McDonald, Iver K. Dahl, John H. McDonald, John McDonald, Andrew Mattson. This being ditch No. 30.

That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of Amalgamated Union of
