AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF Petition, State of Minnesota, County of Anoka, ss.

Whereas, the viewers appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of said County of Anoka, at their session held on the 12th day of March, 1893, upon the petition of Hans Hanson, Andrew Hanson, G. W. Pulver, Lars P. Hanson, Nickolas Smith, and others, bearing date the 1st day of February, 1893, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, have made their report and filed the same in my office.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their session to be held at Court House in the City of Anoka, in said county, on the 11th day of July, 1893, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The place of commencement of said ditch at its source is as follows: Main line north commencing about 120 rods west of center of section 1, town 32, range 22, thence in a general northerly course through said section 1 and the sw 1/4 section 30, town 33, range 22; thence northwesterly through sw 1/4 nw 1/4 section 30, e 1/2 ne 1/4 section 35; thence northeasterly through se 1/4 se 1/4 section 28 and the s 1/2 sw 1/4 section 25; thence northwesterly and northerly through n 1/2 sw 1/4 and w 1/4 of nw 1/4 section 25 and sw 1/4 of sw 1/4 section 24, all in town 33, range 22, to county ditch No. 12, and there terminating. Main line south commencing at starting point of main line north in section 1; thence in a southerly direction through w 1/2 sw 1/4 section 1, w 1/2 nw 1/4 section 12, nw 1/4 sw 1/4 section 12, e 1/2 of se 1/4 section 11, and ne 1/4 ne 1/4 section 14, all in town 32, range 22 to Howard Lake in ne 1/4 ne 1/4 said section 14; also branch No. 1, commencing in main line south about 25 rods south of its starting point; thence in a general southwesterly direction through nw 1/4 sw 1/4 section 1, e 1/2 se 1/4 section 2, e 1/2 section 11, and n 1/2 ne 1/4 section 14, all in town 32, range 22, and terminating in Howard Lake in ne 1/4 ne 1/4 said section 14; also branch No. 2, commencing on the west line of sw 1/4 nw 1/4 section 11, town 32, range 22; thence northeasterly through s 1/2 of nw 1/4 section 11, ne 1/4 nw 1/4 and nw 1/4 ne 1/4 section 11; thence in a southeasterly direction through ne 1/4 section 11, and sw 1/4 nw 1/4 section 12, and terminating in main ditch in n pt nw 1/4 sw 1/4 section 12, all in town 32, range 22; also branch No. 3, commencing at nw cor nw 1/4 sw 1/4 section 1, town 32, range 22; thence in a southeasterly direction to ~~Howard Lake~~ in nw 1/4 sw 1/4 of section 1.

That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of Auditor's Notice of Pendency of Petition hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for three successive weeks, and that all said publications were made in the English language. That said notice was first inserted, printed and published in said newspaper on Wednesday, the 8th day of June, 1893, and was printed and published therein on each and every Wednesday thereafter until and including Wednesday, the 29th day of June, 1893; that during all the time aforesaid said newspaper was a collection of general and local news, comments and miscellaneous literary items, and regularly issued and published on Wednesday of each week from a known office of publication, said office being equipped with the necessary materials, including press, and skilled workmen for producing the same, and has consisted of not less than four pages, of more than five columns to the page, each column not less than seventeen and three-fourths inches in length, and never made up wholly of patents, plates and advertisements, or either or any of them, and has not been substantially a duplicate of any other newspaper, and has been regularly delivered each week to more than two-hundred and forty paid subscribers, and that said newspaper, composed and consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the English language weekly, and generally circulated in Anoka county for more than one year next preceding the date of the first publication of said notice. That the publisher of said newspaper on the 3rd day of May, 1893, filed with the County Auditor of said Anoka County, an affidavit setting forth the facts required by Section 2, of Chapter 33, of the laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1893.
