Main ditch, 7313 cu. yds. estimated at 20c; branches 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15 and Penoch branch, 55,462 cu. yds. estimated at 15c; 290 sta. clearing and grubbing est. at \$435; 42 ft. 48 in. corrugated iron culvert est. at \$112; 32 ft. 30 in. corrugated iron culvert est. at \$47; 325 ft. 24 in. corrugated iron culvert est. at \$409; total estimated cost of construction \$11,028.60; total length of ditch 15.3 miles; width of bottom 2 ft.; depth 3 to 5 feet.
