To the County Board of the County of Anoka, Minnesota: The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent and state that they are the owners of lands that have been heretofore assessed for the construction of Ditch No. 32 of Anoka County. That the said ditch and its fixtures are in need of repairs and that its use and enjoyment has been greatly impaired by reason of the following facts: First, that said ditch has become obstructed by the deposit of sediment upon and along the bottom, sides, banks and near ends thereof; Second, that by reason of the same many places are almost entirely filled; Third, that in the construction of Ditch No. 32, a portion of the lands originally tributary to Ditch #2 had been tributary to Ditch #3 and has been assessed for its construction, but to secure the benefits from Ditch #3 will require the opening, widening and deepening of portions of Ditch #2 and its branches tributary to Ditch #3; Fourth, that its banks are eroding from the ditch, many places in the main ditch and branches will require opening, widening and deepening. Therefore, your petitioners pray that you will appoint a committee to ascertain and report to you the necessity of the action, and the cost of making such repairs, and when such report is filed such other and further proceedings may be had as may be necessary for the repair of such ditch and branches, and the opening, widening and deepening of the same as may appear necessary.

That the said ditch and its appurtenances are in need of repairs and that its usefulness has become greatly impaired by reason of the following facts: First, That said ditch has become obstructed by the deposit of sediment therein and by the growth of weeds and grasses upon and along the bottom, sides, banks and easements along its banks and across and through the same many places are almost entirely filled. That on the lands originally tributary to a portion of the lands originally tributary to Ditch 32 has become tributary to Ditch 58 and has been assessed for its construction, but to secure the benefits from its construction, but to secure the same, it is necessary to divert the water from Ditch 58 and deposit it into Ditch 32, and its banks are in such a condition that to secure the benefits from the ditch, many places in this ditch and branches will require opening, widening and deepening. Therefore, Your petitioners pray that you will appoint a committee to ascertain and report to you the necessity thereof, and the cost of making such repairs, and when such reports are filed such other and further proceedings may be had as may be necessary for the repair, widening and deepening of the same, as may appear necessary.
