PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

Came personally before me Granville S. Pease, and being duly sworn deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the publisher and printer of the Anoka County UNION, a weekly newspaper printed and published in Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Wednesday

day of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of County Auditor's Notice of Pendency of Petition hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for three successive weeks, and that all said publications were made in the English language. AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF PETITION.

Whereas, the viewers appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of said County of Anoka, at their session held on the 3rd day of May, 1893, upon the petition of Daniel Peebles, John Divine, F. S. Clement, S. W. Shafer, C. F. Behue and others, bearing date the 6th day of January, 1893, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, have made their report and filed the same in my office. Said ditch to be numbered 34.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their session to be held at the Court House, in the City of Anoka, in said County, on the 3rd day of September, 1898, at 10 o'clock a. m.
