PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, }

Came personally before me Chas. P. Cook
and being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he now is and during
all the time hereinafter mentioned has been ^{one of} the managers and
printers of The Anoka Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and pub-
lished in the City of Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Friday of
each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed

has been regularly delivered each week to more than two hundred
and forty paid subscribers, and that said newspaper, composed and
consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the Eng-
lish language and generally circulated in Anoka County for more
than one year next preceding the date of the first publication of said

AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDEN- CY OF PETITION.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, }
County of Anoka, } ss.

Whereas, the petition of Henry Lee and others, bearing date the 12th day of April, 1902, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, has been filed in my office,

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their special session to be held at Auditor's office, in the City of Anoka, in said County, on the 2nd day of June, 1902, at 10 o'clock a. m.

A true copy of said petition is as follows, to-wit:

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota:

The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for the expense of the construction of the public ditch or water course hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and well fare require the establishment and construction of a public ditch or water course along the following described route in the town of Blaine in said County of Anoka and that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said ditch is as follows:

Commencing in sec. 29, said town of Blaine on land belonging to Albert Gottwaldt, being the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of $nw\frac{1}{4}$ of said section 29, thence running along the following route: through section 29-20 and 19 in said town in a northerly direction and terminating at Sand Creek Ditch in section 18, said town of Blaine, being in the $n\frac{1}{2}$ of said section 18, as its outlet and other branches as may be deemed necessary in the opinion of the viewers.

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to establish such ditch or water course and cause the same to be constructed as provided by chapter two hundred and fifty-eight (258) of the General Laws of Minnesota for 1901, and subsequent amendments thereto.
