PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, }

Came personally before me Charles L. Cook
 and being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he now is and during
 all the time hereinafter mentioned has been the manager and
 printer of The Anoka Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and pub-
 lished in the City of Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Friday of
 each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed
notice of sale of ditching jobs
 hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was in-
 serted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week
 for three successive weeks, and that all of said pub-
 lications were made in the English language. That said notice was
 first inserted, printed and published in said newspaper on Friday,
 the 3rd day of October 1902, and was

 has been regularly delivered each week to more than two hundred
 and forty paid subscribers, and that said newspaper, composed and
 consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the Eng-
 lish language and generally circulated in Anoka County for more
 than one year next preceding the date of the first publication of said
 notice. That the publishers of said newspaper prior to the date of
 the publication of said notice, filed with the County Auditor of said
 Anoka County, an affidavit setting forth the facts required by Sec-
 tion 2, Chapter 33, of the laws of the State of Minnesota for the year

SALE OF DITCHING JOBS.

Notice is hereby given, that, on the 20th day of October, 1902, at 10 o'clock a. m., at the office of the County Auditor, in the Court House, in the City of Anoka, County of Anoka, Minn., I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the Ditch No. 39 of Anoka County, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka County, State of Minnesota, by their order bearing date September 8th, 1902, viz.: 1st, the work of constructing the whole ditch as one job. 2nd, in sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the engineer in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source from station No. 179 plus 16 to station 0. Beginning at station 179 plus 16, which station is about 800 feet westerly from the southeast corner of section No. 12, T. 31, R. 24, and running thence southeasterly in section No. 13, T. 31, R. 24, and sections No. 18, 19, 20 and 29, T. 31, R. 23, and ending at station No. 0, near the center 1-16 corner of the NW 1/4 of Sec. 29, T. 31, R. 23, to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, and that bids are invited for said work, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said engineer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in the said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file, and may be seen at my office.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check payable to the auditor of said county for not less than ten per cent of the amount of each bid. The right to reject any and all bids is hereby reserved.
