SALE OF DITCHING JOBS.

Notice is hereby given, that, on the 3d day of August, 1889, at 10 o'clock a. m., at the County Auditor's office, in the city of Anoka, Minn., I will sell the jobs of digging and constructing the ditch No. 4, (known as John Johnson ditch), of Anoka county, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka county, State of Minnesota, by their order bearing date June 8th, 1889, viz: In sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the viewers in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source. The place of commencement of said ditch, at its source, is as follows: In the north part of nw¹/₄ of section 4, township 32, range 23, thence through the se¹/₄ of said section 4, through n¹/₂ of section 9, and nw¹/₄ of sw¹/₄ of said section 9, through n¹/₂ of se¹/₄ of section 8, terminating in ditch No. 2, (called Heglund ditch), in said section 8, all being in township 32, range 23, to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said viewer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction, in any case, as stated in the said order; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond, with two freehold securities, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file, and may be seen at my office.
