AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF PETITION.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, } ss.

Whereas, The petition of O. Brenning and others, bearing date the 25th day of February, 1903, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, has been filed in my office.

Now, therefore, Notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners at their regular session to be held at Auditor's office, in the city of Ancker, in said county, on the 15th day of July, 1903, at 10 o'clock a.m.

A true copy of said petition is as follows, to-wit: To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota. The undersigned land owners, whose hands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for the expense of the construction of the public ditch or water course hereinafter described, would respectively represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a public ditch or water course along the following described route in the town of Linwood in said county of Anoka, and that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said ditch is as follows: Commencing a point about twenty rods south of the south end of Long Lake, so called, in lot numbered two (2) of section twenty-five (25), township thirty-four (34), range twenty-two (22), west thence running along the following route: West in a generally southwesterly course for a distance of about two hundred (200) rods, thence natural water course to a point where said water course passes under the road known as the Linwood and Stearns road, and terminating at said last named point, the above described water course acting as its outlet into the middle branch.

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to establish such public ditch and cause the same to be constructed as provided by Chapter Two Hundred and Forty-eight (257) of the General Laws of Minnesota for 1901, and subsequent amendments thereof.
