PETITION FOR PUBLIC DITCH.

(Copy)

To the Board of County Commissioners

of the County of Ancker State of Minnesota:

The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for, the expense of the construction of the Boston ditch hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare ~~and the redemption of wet and over~~

~~these lands~~ require the establishment and construction of a ditch of ample capacity to drain the land along the following described route in the Towns of Blaine and Coates in said County of Ancker

and that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said ditch is as follows:

Commencing at a point near the center of section thirty three in the town of Blaine. Thence running along the following route: Northwesterly, northerly and westerly through sections twenty eight, (28) forty one (41) and forty two (42) of range (17) and (18) of township (18) and over (7) in the town of Blaine through the northeast corner of section (12) in town of Coates and ending in the east bank of Coates at or near the mouth of Coates. Section (13) and terminating at a point near the line between sections twenty two and twenty three in said town of Coates. With said road bridge, as it is called; also branches from said ditch as may be found necessary.
