Auditor's Notice of Pendancy of Petition.

STATE OF MINNESOTA, } ss
County of Anoka. }

Whereas the petition of G. J Swanson and others bearing date the 12th day of June 1903, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, has been filed in my office.

Now therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition and that the same will be heard and determined before the said Board of County Commissioners, at their special session to be held at the Auditor's office in the City of Anoka, in said County, on the 7th day of September, 1903, at 10 o'clock a. m.

A true copy of said petition is as follows, to-wit:

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota:
The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be effected by, or assessed for the expense of the construction of the ditch hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a ditch of ample capacity to drain the land along the following described route in the Towns of Blaine and Anoka, in said County of Anoka, and that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said ditch is as follows:
Commencing at a point near the center of section thirty-three in the Town of Blaine, thence running along the following route: Northeastly, northerly and westerly through sections twenty-eight (28), twenty-one (21), sixteen (16), seventeen (17), eight (8), eighteen (18) and seven (7) in the Town of Blaine, and through the southeast quarter of twelves (12) in Town of Anoka and emptying into Sand creek at or near the south line of section thirteen (13) and terminating at a point near the line between sections twelve (12) and thirteen (13) in said Town of Anoka, with said Sand creek as its outlet, also branches from said ditch as may be found necessary.
