**Auditor's Notice of Pendency of Ditch Petition.**

STATE OF MINNESOTA, }

Whereas, the petition of W. J. McKinney and others, bearing date the 7th day of April, 1905, and on file in my office, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, has been filed in my office.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and determined before the said board of county commissioners, at their regular session to be held at the Auditor's office in the court house in the city of Anoka, in said county, on the 9th day of May, 1905, at eleven o'clock a. m.

A true copy of said petition is as follows, to wit:

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota:

The undersigned land owners whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for the expense of the construction of the public ditch hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare and the reclamation of wet and overflowed lands require the establishment and construction of a public ditch along the following described route in the town of Burns, in said county of Anoka, and that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said ditch is as follows:

Commencing at the center of Section eighteen (18) in Township thirty-three (33) and Range twenty-five (25), thence easterly by the most feasible course, to Goose lake, so called, thence across Goose lake to the outlet thereof, thence in a general course following the brook flowing from said outlet, known as Ford brook, across a portion of Section ten (10) said Town and Range, and a portion of Section eleven (11), said Town and Range, and terminating at the intersection of said Ford brook with the east and west quarter line of said Section eleven (11), in said Ford brook as its outlet; together with all necessary and proper branches and extensions.

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to establish such public ditch, branches and extensions, and cause the same to be constructed as provided by Chapter two hundred and fifty-eight (258) of the General Laws of Minnesota for 1901, and subsequent amendments thereto.
