objection of certain
landowners to creation
of drain

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners, Anoka County, Minn.
As Attorney for and at the request of a number of the land owners
who have been assessed for benefits to accrue to their lands by
reason of the construction of ditch # 45, of Anoka County, Minnesota, I
desire to state the objections of such land owners to the further ex-
penditure of money on such work and their reasons therefor.

The drain, as designed by the engineer is impracticable and will
never give any effective benefit to the lands adjacent thereto for the
reason that the tiling selected and approved by the engineer and used
as far as the ditch has been constructed, permits the sand and other
debris to escape into the tiling, filling the same and thereby checking
and impeding the flow of water, that said tiling does not and will not
remain at the level at which it is laid but being loose jointed
will break at the joints and at certain places will be raised and at
others lowered thereby stopping the flow of water and making the drain
practically useless for any benefits.

The drain so far as it is now built was laid under the direct
supervision of the engineer in charge and in the manner indicated
and approved by him and all of the work done has been accepted and
approved and has been built according to the plans and specifications
yet the conditions as above indicated exist. No volume of water is
passing through said drain and none of any amount has passed through
this season although large volume has covered the entire at the
head of the ditch.


Expert Engineers have informed the complaining landowners that
the tiling being used in the construction of this drain will never give
satisfactory results and that they will never afford any material
benefit to their lands; that the lands of the character of their lands
cannot be drained with tile draining effectively so as to give any
benefit unless the joints are cemented and provision made at certain
intervals in the ditch to allow the sand and other debris naturally
coming into the drain to be taken care of, and even in this event

it is very doubtful whether an effective drain could be established.

The landowners I represent desire to present these objections at this time, having gained this information but recently, and earnestly request that your honorable body take such action as may be necessary for a full investigation of said matter to the end that justice and right may be done to all persons interested.

I regret that I cannot personally present these matters to your Board but I have to be absent from the City at the time of your meeting.
