SALE OF DITCHING JOBS.

The sale of ditching jobs of Ditch No. 43, of Anoka County, Minn., was opened at the county auditor's office in the court house in the city of Anoka, Minn., March 23, 1906, at 2 o'clock P. M. by reading the annexed printed notice of sale of ditching jobs and statement made that at this sale of ditching jobs is offered, first, the digging of the whole ditch as one job, and, second, in sections of 100 feet each by the yard. The estimate of the engineer as made by him and on file to be taken as the number of yards between the stakes as numbered by him, sale commencing at the outlet of the ditch and selling to its source.

Notice is hereby given, That, on the 23rd day of March, 1906, at 2 o'clock P. M., at the auditor's office in the city of Anoka, county of Anoka and state of Minnesota, I will sell the jobs and let the contracts for digging and constructing the Ditch No. 43 of Anoka County, established by the Board of County Commissioners of Anoka County, state of Minnesota, viz: their order bearing date February 27th, 1906, viz: In one job and contract of 100 sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, and shown by the report of the engineer in and matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source, which ditch contains the approximate amount of work following, viz: Total number of cubic yards, main branch ditch, 9530. Total number of cubic yards, 91 to 129.49 and the estimated cost of which ditch is two thousand eight hundred seventy-seven and 58/100 dollars, to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, and that bids are invited for said work as one job, and also for any one or more sections thereof; said work to be completed within the time required and in the manner specified. In said engineer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction of the part of said work covered by such bid, and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond in a sum not less than the contract price, to be approved by the auditor of said county, within two freehold surcharges for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file and may be seen at any time.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check payable to the auditor of said county for not less than ten per cent of the amount of each bid.

The right to reject any and all bids is hereby reserved.
