Auditor's Notice of Pendency of Petition.

Whereas, The petition of Hudson Guy and others, bearing date the 9th day of July, 1906, praying for the establishment of a public ditch and branches along the route proposed therein, has been filed in my office. Now, therefore, notice is hereby given, of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and considered by and before the Board of County Commissioners at their special session to be held at the court house in the city of Anoka, in said county, on the 30th day of August, 1906, at 11 o'clock a. m.

A true copy of said petition is as follows, to-wit: To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota. The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by or assessed for the expense of the construction of the public ditch and branches hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a public ditch and branches along the following described route in the town of Oak Grove in said county of Anoka, and that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility, and is necessary for the following reasons, among others, to-wit: That large acres of land along the course of the proposed ditch are now wet, overgrown and rendered useless for any purpose, which by the construction of the proposed ditch would be rendered productive and useful for farming and other purposes, and large quantities of stagnant water which now constitute a menace to public health would be removed by said proposed ditch.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said public ditch is as follows: Commencing at the lowest point in the marsh in SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of section 36, thence running northerly across the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said section, and across the SW 1/4 of section 3, Lot 3, Lot 4, and NW 1/4 of NE 1/4 of section 25, and across the SW 1/4 of section 21, all in township 33 and range 24, to Cedar Creek, and terminating in said Cedar Creek as its outlet together with such branch or branches as may be necessary and proper to render said ditch most useful and beneficial. And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to establish such public ditch and branch or branches and cause the same to be constructed as provided by chapter forty-four (44) of the Revised Laws of 1905, and acts supplementary thereto and amendatory thereof.
