AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF HEARING AFTER Viewers' Report in Ditch Proceedings.

In the matter of the petition of N. O. Rumby and others for a public ditch in the county of Anoka, state of Minnesota:

Notice is hereby given, that, whereas, a petition has been filed in the office of the county auditor of said county, praying for the establishment and construction of the ditch herein referred to, and the civil engineer appointed by the board of county commissioners of said county to make a survey of the route of said ditch has completed his work and made due report thereof and filed said report in the office of the county auditor of said county, and the viewers appointed by said board of county commissioners to view the same have completed their work and filed their report thereof in the office of said county auditor, which report as specified and laid out in said petition, said report of said engineer, and the report of said viewers, commences in the southwest part of the sec 1/4 of ne 1/4 of Sec. 16, T. 32, R. 22; thence westerly to the west line of the said sec 1/4 of ne 1/4, Sec. 16, thence south 500 feet; thence southwesterly in the w 1/2 of sec 1/4 of said Sec. 16 to the west line of said west half; thence south on the line between the sec 1/2 and the sw 1/4 of Sec. 16, and the ne 1/4 and the nw 1/4 of Sec. 21, 1100 feet, thence southerly and easterly through the e 1/2 of the nw 1/4 and the s 1/2 of the ne 1/4 of Sec. 21, and the s 1/2 of the nw 1/4 of Sec. 22, and there ending in the marac swamp on the east side of the old St. Paul & Duluth road, in the se part of the s 1/2 of the nw 1/4, Sec. 22, T. 32, R. 22, and has certain proposed branches, the descriptions of which are as follows:

Branch No. 1. Commencing in the southwest part of the sw 1/4 of nw 1/4 of Sec. 15, T. 32, R. 22, and running thence southerly in the w 1/2 of the nw 1/4 and west part of the w 1/2 of sw 1/4 of Sec. 16 and the ne 1/4 of ne 1/4 of Sec. 20, and the nw 1/4 of nw 1/4 and the ne 1/4 of nw 1/4 of Sec. 21, and entering the main ditch in the ne 1/4 of nw 1/4 of Sec. 21, T. 32, R. 22.

Branch No. 2. Commencing in the north part of the se 1/4 of sw 1/4 of Sec. 21, T. 32, R. 22, and thence running northerly in the ne 1/4 of the sw 1/4 and the se 1/4 of nw 1/4 of Sec. 21, and there entering the main line in the se 1/4 of nw 1/4 of Sec. 21, T. 32, R. 22.

Branch No. 3. Commencing on the east side of the road in the nw 1/4 of sw 1/4, Sec. 15, T. 32, R. 22, thence following the road south for a distance of 350 feet, thence southwesterly and southerly in the e 1/2 of se 1/4, Sec. 16, and ne 1/4 of ne 1/4 and the se 1/4 of ne 1/4, Sec. 21, and there entering the main line.

Branch No. 4. Commencing on the east side of the road, which lies on the west side of the sw 1/4 of the sw 1/4 of Sec. 15, T. 32, R. 22, and thence running westerly in the se 1/2 of the se 1/4 of Sec. 16, a distance of 230 feet and there entering the Branch No. 3.

Branch No. 5. Commencing near the center of the sw 1/4 of the se 1/4, Sec. 21, T. 32, R. 22, and thence running northeasterly in the sw 1/4 of se 1/4 and the se 1/4 of the se 1/4 and the ne 1/2 of the se 1/4 and the se 1/4 of the ne 1/4 of Sec. 21, and there entering the main ditch; which said ditch and the said branches thereof, as appears from said report of said engineer, pass through certain lands and affect certain roads, railroads, municipal corporations and other corporations, the descriptions of which lands, roads, and railroads, and the names of the owners thereof, and of the municipal and other corporations so affected thereby are as follows, to wit:
