and being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been one of the managers and printers of The Anoka Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Friday of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed Notice of Sale in Ditch Proceedings hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for three successive weeks, and that all of said publications were made in the English Language. NOTICE OF SALE IN DITCH PROCEEDINGS.

Sale of Ditching Jobs.

Notice is hereby given, that, on the 31st day of August, 1907, at 10:30 o'clock a. m., at the auditor's office in the court house in the city of Anoka, I will sell the jobs and let the contract for digging and constructing the ditch No 47 of Anoka county, established by the board of county commissioners of Anoka county, state of Minnesota, by their order bearing date August 1, 1907, viz: In one job and contract, or in sections of 100 feet each, each of said sections to be known and numbered by stakes, as shown by the report of the engineer in said matter, commencing at the one including the outlet, and from thence, successively, up stream to the one including the source; which ditch contains the approximate amount of work following, viz:

Excavating 3482.02 cubic yards and the estimated cost of which ditch is \$501.73 (for excavating) to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, and that bids are invited for said work as one job, and also for any one or more sections thereof; said work to be completed within the time required, and in the manner specified, in said engineer's report. And no bid will be entertained which exceeds more than thirty (30) per cent over and above the estimated cost of the construction of the part of said work covered by such bid; and the successful bidder will be required to give a satisfactory bond in a sum not less than the contract price, to be approved by the auditor of said county, with two freshhold sureties, for the faithful performance and fulfillment of his contract, and to pay all damages that may accrue by reason of his failure to complete the job within the time required in the contract. The said order and estimates and profile are on file, and may be seen at my office.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check payable to the auditor of said county, for not less than ten per cent of the amount of each bid.

The right to reject any and all bids is hereby reserved.
