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AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF HEARING AFTER Viewers' Report in Ditch Proceedings.

In the matter of the petition of Julius E. Hard and others for a public ditch in the county of Anoka, state of Minnesota:

Notice is hereby given, that, whereas, a petition has been filed in the office of the county auditor of said county, praying for the establishment and construction of the ditch herein referred to, and the civil engineer appointed by the board of county commissioners of said county to make a survey of the route of said ditch has completed his work and made due report thereof and filed said report in the office of the county auditor of said county, and the viewers appointed by said board of county commissioners to view the same have completed their work and filed their report thereof in the office of said county auditor; which ditch as specified and laid out in said petition, said report of said engineer, and the report of said viewers, commences at the point at which branch No. 1 enters Clearwater Creek on the section line between sections number 23 and 24, T. 31, R. 22, just north of the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between the said sections; thence westerly in the $se\frac{1}{4}$ and $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of section 23 and ending in the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of section No. 23, T. 31, R. 22, following the bed of Clearwater Creek.

Branch No. 1. Commencing at the point 130 feet north of the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner in the center of section 26, T. 31, R. 22, thence south along the $\frac{1}{4}$ line running north and south in the said section No. 26 to the se corner of the $n\frac{1}{2}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of the $nw\frac{1}{4}$ of said section No. 26; thence northwesterly to a point in the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of the $nw\frac{1}{4}$ of said section No. 26 thence northeasterly in the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of the $nw\frac{1}{4}$ and $nw\frac{1}{4}$ of $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of section 26; the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$, and the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 23, to the 1-16 corner at the ne corner of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 23, thence north on the section line between sections 23 and 24 to the end in Clearwater Creek where the said creek crosses said section line.

Branch No. 2. Commencing in the southeast corner of the $n\frac{1}{2}$ of the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ in Sec. 23, T. 31, R. 22, thence southerly in said $n\frac{1}{2}$ of the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of said Sec. 23 and the $s\frac{1}{2}$ of the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of the said Sec. 23 to the main line.

Branch No. 3. Commencing at the 1-16 corner on the north line of the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 26, T. 31, R. 22, thence northwesterly in the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of the $ne\frac{1}{4}$ of section 26 and the $sw\frac{1}{4}$ of the $se\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 23, all in T. 31, R. 22, which said ditch and the said branches thereof, as appears from the said report of said engineer pass through certain lands and effect certain roads, railroads, municipal corporations and other corporations, the descriptions of which lands, roads, and railroads, and the names of the owners thereof and of the municipal and other corporations so affected thereby, are as follows, to-wit:

D. 1907, at 10:30 o'clock in the forenoon of said day, at the auditor's office in the city of Anoka, in said county of Anoka, for hearing on, and consideration of, said petition, said surveyor's report, said viewers' report, and the determination of whether or not said ditch shall be established and constructed; and that at said time and place all persons interested in the establishment and construction of said ditch are invited and requested to appear and be heard both for and against the same.

PRINTER'S AFFIDAVIT.

Came personally before me *R. P. Chaney*
and being duly sworn, deposes and says, that he now is and during all the time hereinafter mentioned has been one of the managers and printers of The Anoka Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Anoka, in said Anoka County, on Friday of each week. That he knows of his own knowledge that the printed Auditor's Notice of Hearing after hereto attached, cut from the columns of said newspaper, was inserted, printed and published in said newspaper once in each week for 3 successive weeks, and that all of said publications were made in the English Language. That said notice was first inserted, printed and published in said newspaper on Friday, the 5th day of July 1907, and was printed and published therein on each and every Friday thereafter until and including Friday, the 19th day of July 1907; that during all the time aforesaid said newspaper was a collection of general and local news, comments and miscellaneous literary items, and regularly issued and published on Friday of each week from a known office of publication, said office being equipped with the necessary material and skilled workmen for producing the same, and has consisted of not less than four pages, of five columns or more to each page, each column not less than seven-teen and three-fourths inches in length, and never made up wholly of patents, plates and advertisements, or either or any of them, and has not been substantially a duplicate of any other newspaper, and has been regularly delivered each week to more than two hundred and forty paid subscribers, and that said newspaper, composed and consisting as above set forth, was printed and published in the English language and generally circulated in Anoka County for more than one year next preceding the date of the first publication of said notice. That the publishers of said newspaper prior to the date of the publication of said notice, filed with the County Auditor of said Anoka County, an affidavit setting forth the facts required by Section 2, Chapter 33, of the laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1893.
