## NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF DITCH PETITION.

State of Minnesota, County of Anoka—ss. Whereas, the petition of M. C. Blanchett and others, bearing date the 29th day of October, 1907, praying for the establishment of a public county ditch along the route proposed therein, has been filed in my office, now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition and that the same will be heard and considered by and before the board of county commissioners at their special session to be held at the auditor's office in the city of Anoka in said county commencing on the 3rd day of December, 1907, at 11 o'clock a. m.

A true copy of said petition is as follows, to wit:

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota:

The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by or assessed for the expense of the construction of the public county ditch hereinafter described would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a public county ditch along the following described route in the town of Burns, county of Anoka, state of Minnesota; that the construction of the same would be a public benefit and utility for the following reasons, to-wit:

1st. It will be a public benefit for it will, if constructed, drain in the neighborhood of one thousand (1000) acres of wet, worthless land and convert the same into good hay lands.

2nd. It will improve the public health in that it will drain many acres of stagnant water which may at any time injure the health of those who live near the water.

3rd. It will improve the lands, which will increase the taxes of the town of Burns.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of the said ditch is as follows:

Commencing at the lowest point in the  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the  $\frac{3}{4}$  of section 15, T. 33, R. 25, W. of the 4th P. M. in the said town of Burns in the county of Anoka, and running thence northerly in the said section 15, and easterly in sections 6 and 10 and connecting with the natural drain between Nigger lake and Goose lake in section 16, and thence following the said natural drain in said section 16 and terminating in Goose lake in sections 15 and 16, all in T. 33, R. 25 in the town of Burns in the county of Anoka.

Your petitioners also pray that the necessary branches may be laid to drain all the wet and marshy lands that can be drained by this main ditch with reasonable expense.

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to establish such county ditch and cause the same to be constructed as provided by chapter number 230 of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota for the year 1905, and laws amendatory thereto.
