AUDITOR'S NOTICE OF PENDENCY OF PETITION.

State of Minnesota, County of Anoka, ss.

Whereas the petition of T. H. Scholbrook and others, bearing date the 2nd day of March, 1908, praying for the establishment of a public ditch along the route proposed therein, has been filed in my office.

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition, and that the same will be heard and considered by and before the board of county commissioners, at their special session to be held at the auditor's office in the City of Anoka, in said county, on the 8th day of May, 1908, at eleven o'clock a. m.

A true copy of said petition is as follows, to-wit:

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota.

The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for the expense of, the construction of the public ditch hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a public ditch along the following described route in the Town of Burns, in said County of Anoka, and that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility; and is necessary for the following reasons to-wit: That it would drain and render titiable a large quantity of land which is now wet, overflowed and of no use for any purpose; that it would remove large quantities of stagnant water, which are now a menace to the public health.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said ditch is as follows:

Commencing at the lowest point in the sw $\frac{1}{4}$ of the sw $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 14, in T. 33, R. 25, and thence running along the following route: From said point in a northeasterly direction across the n $\frac{1}{2}$ of the sw $\frac{1}{4}$, the nw $\frac{1}{4}$ of the se $\frac{1}{4}$, the ne $\frac{1}{4}$ of the se $\frac{1}{4}$ and the se $\frac{1}{4}$ of the ne $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 14, to Ford brook, and terminating at said Ford brook as its outlet, with such branch or branches as may be advantageous and render said ditch of the greatest benefit.

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to establish such public ditch and branches and cause the same to be constructed as provided by Chapter Two Hundred and Thirty (230) of the General Laws of Minnesota of 1905, and laws amendatory thereto.
