NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That a petition has been filed in the office of the county auditor of said Anoka County, Minnesota, praying for the construction of a public ditch running through the following lands and described as follows:

Main Line—Commencing on the west line of Township No. 32 North, Range 25 West, of the 4th Principal Meridian, 4.75 chains south of the One-Fourth Section Corner on the west side of Sec. No. 7 of said township and range, and running thence southeasterly through the sw 1/4 of said Sec. 7, which land is owned by C. N. Branch No. 1—Commencing on the nw 1/4 of nw 1/4 of Sec. 7 owned by H. Chaster and running thence south through the sw 1/4 of nw 1/4 of Sec. 7 owned by W. H. Houlton; and south through the nw 1/4 of sw 1/4 of Sec. 7 and emptying into the main line of Ditch No. 51 at Station Eleven of that ditch on the lands owned by C. N. Clark.

Lateral One of Branch No. 1 of Ditch No. 51—Commencing on the ne 1/4 of the se 1/4 of Sec. 7 owned by C. N. Clark and running northwesterly through the se 1/4 of the nw 1/4 of Sec. 7 owned by Carrie Ferrin; and westerly into the sw 1/4 of the nw 1/4 of Sec. 7 and there emptying into Branch No. 1 at Station 19 of said ditch.

is divided into 100 ore. Day labor on farms in southern Sweden is paid about 25 ore an hour. Flour mill employees in Stockholm get 95 kroner a month, minimum wage for skilled men and in southern Sweden, 90 kroner. Bakers in Stockholm, minimum wage per week, \$5.40. Sugar refineries in Stockholm, 40 ore an hour; in the rest of the country, 35 ore. Brewery workers in Stockholm, 95 to 100 kroner a month; outside, 80 kroner. Textile workers, of southern Sweden, 30 ore an hour for men and up to 20 ore for women. Tailors, Stockholm, 20 to 25 kroner a week; outside, 16 to 18 kroner. In nearly all trades fifty-five hours make a week.
