PETITION FOR PUBLIC DITCH.

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka,
State of Minnesota:

The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for the expense of, the construction of the public ditch and branches hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a public ditch and branches along the following described route in the Town...of Anoka in said County of Anoka

that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility, and is necessary for the following reasons, to-wit: Large areas of land along the course of the proposed ditch are wet, over flowed, and largely covered with stagnant water, constituting a menace to the public health, and are useless for any purpose, which would be rendered valuable for farming and other purposes by the construction of such proposed ditch and branches, and the public health would be benefited by the removal of such stagnant water.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said public ditch is as follows:
Commencing at the lowest point in the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section Fifteen, Township Thirtyone, Range Twentyfour

thence running along the following route: Southerly, following generally the natural flow of the water, through said section Fifteen, and southeasterly through sections twenty two and twenty three, said town and Range, following generally the present ditch

and terminating at Corn Creek in said section twenty three

as its outlet

together with such branch & branches as may be necessary to drain the territory tributary to said ditch, and to render the same most beneficial and effectual.
