Notice of Pendency on Repair Petition.

Whereas, the petition of Daniel Peebles and others, bearing date the 14th day of April, 1915, praying for the repair of County Ditch No. 53, has been filed in my office, Now, Therefore, Notice is hereby given of the pendency of said petition and that the same will be heard and considered by and before the Board of County Commissioners at its special session to be held at the court house in the city of Anoka, county of Anoka and State of Minnesota on the 20th day of May, A. D. 1915, at 11 o'clock A. M.

A true copy of said petition is as follows:

PETITION.

To the County Board of the County of Anoka, Minnesota: The undersigned petitioners respectfully represent and state: That they are the owners of lands that have been heretofore assessed for the construction of County Ditch No. 53 of Anoka County; That said ditch is in need of repairs and that its usefulness for the purpose for which it was constructed has become greatly impaired by reason of the following Facts: First, That said ditch has become obstructed by the deposit of sediment therein and by the growth of weeds and grasses upon and along the bottom, sides, banks and right of way thereof. Second, That by reason of the construction of side and ateral ditches emptying into said ditch the volume of water to be taken care of by said county ditch No. 53 has been increased beyond the capacity thereof. Third, That the outlet of said ditch has become filled up, the tiling broken, and by reason thereof the whole of said ditch and branches does not serve its purpose; that it is necessary to open the outlet, repair and replace the tiling therein. Wherefore, Your petitioners pray that you will appoint a civil engineer to ascertain and report to you the necessity therefor and the cost of making such repairs, and when such report is filed such other and further proceedings may be had as may be necessary for the repair of such ditch.

That on the Ninth day of August, 1911, the affidavit of R. P. Chase, Secretary of said corporation, publisher of said newspaper, was filed in the office of the County Auditor of said Anoka County, for the purpose of complying with Section 5516 of the Revised Laws, 1905.
