PETITION FOR PUBLIC DITCH.

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka
State of Minnesota:

The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for the expense of, the construction of the Ditch hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the public health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a Ditch along the following described route in the Town of Blaine in said County of Anoka

that the construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility, and is necessary for the following reasons, to-wit: to drain large areas of land now flooded and useless, and render the same usable and valuable; to drain off stagnant water thereon which now constitutes a menace to the public health.

A general description of the proposed starting point, route and terminus of said Ditch is as follows:

Commencing at or about the quarter stake on the east line of section fourteen (14) & thence southwesterly thro' said section fourteen (14) & southerly thro' section twenty three (23) & thence southeasterly thro' sections twenty six (26) & twenty five (25) until it reaches Golden Lake & thence terminating all in the said town of Blaine Anoka Co. Minn. Township thirty one (31) of Range thence running along the following route: thro'ly thro' (23) & also all branches that may be necessary

and terminating at Golden Lake

as its outlet
