To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota: The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by, or assessed for the expense of, the construction of the public ditch and branches hereinafter described, would respectfully represent that the the public health, convenience and welfare require establishment and construction of a public ditch and branches along the following described route in the Town of Anoka in said County of Anoka, and that the establishment and construction of the same would be of public benefit and utility and will promote the public health and is necessary for the following reasons, towit: The territory to be drained by the proposed public ditch and branches consists of a large area of very low marsh and bog land, which is overflowed and covered with stagnant water during a large portion of the time, and is too wet and soft to be of use during other times, rendering it valueless for any purpose, in its present condition; the soil thereof is of a high quality and very fertile, and when drained, will be of great value for agricultural purposes of various kinds; the stagnant waters upon said lands emit noisome odors and exhalations, and furnish a breeding place for great numbers of maguitoes and other pests, and constitute a menace be the health of the public, which menace will be removed by the dr
