## Auditor's Notice of Hearing.

State of Minnesota, County of Anoka, ss.  
In the matter of the petition of H. N. Douglas and others for a public ditch in the County of Anoka, State of Minnesota:

Notice is hereby given that a petition has been filed in the office of the county auditor of the said Anoka County, Minnesota, praying for the construction of a public ditch through the following lands described in the engineer's report as follows:

**MAIN DITCH:** Commencing in the  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{Sec. 4, T. 31, R. 24, 33}$  feet north and 567.5 feet west of the  $\text{se}$  corner of said section, thence running southwesterly through the  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  and southeasterly through the  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of section 9, and continuing southeasterly through  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of section 10, and continuing southeasterly through  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  and about 500 feet into the  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  all in section 14, T. 31, R. 24, and there ending.

**BRANCH NO. 1,** Commencing north 18 degrees e. 1124 feet of a point 1066 feet west of south one-quarter corner of section 4, T. 31, R. 24, thence running southeasterly through the  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of said section 4, thence east parallel with and 33 feet south of north line of section 9, T. 31, R. 24, through the  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of said section 9, and ending in the main ditch in the  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of said section 9.

**BRANCH NO. 2,** Commencing 1930 feet west of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  corner of  $\text{n}\frac{1}{2}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of section 9, T. 31, R. 24, thence westerly through the  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  and ending in the main ditch in the  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$ , all in section 9, T. 31, R. 24.

**BRANCH NO. 3,** Commencing in the  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of section 9, T. 31, R. 24, thence running northeasterly through the  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$ , and ending in the main ditch in  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$ , all in section 9, T. 31, R. 24.

**BRANCH NO. 4,** Commencing in the  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of section 3, T. 31, R. 24, thence running southerly through  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of said section 3, and continuing southerly through  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\text{sw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{ne}\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$ , all in section 10, T. 31, R. 24, and ending in the main ditch on the south line of said  $\text{nw}\frac{1}{4}$  of  $\text{se}\frac{1}{4}$  of said section 10.

That the engineer appointed by the board to make a survey of the route of said ditch has completed his work and made due report thereon and filed the same in the office of the auditor of said county; that the viewers appointed by said board to view the same have completed their work and filed their report thereon in the office of said auditor.

And, Therefore, The board of county commissioners of said Anoka County will hold a special meeting on Wednesday, the 6th day of January, A. D. 1915, at 10:30 in the forenoon, at the office of the county auditor in the court house in the city of Anoka, in said county for hearing and considering said petition and said engineer's and viewers' reports, and that all persons interested in the construction of said ditch are invited to appear and be heard by and before said board at said time, for or against the construction of said ditch.

R. P. CHASE being duly sworn, on oath says: That he knows of his own knowledge that the annexed printed Auditor's Notice of Hearing hereto attached, was taken from the columns of the newspaper known as THE ANOKA HERALD, and was published in said newspaper for 3 successive weeks, first on Tuesday, the 13<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1914, and thereafter on each successive Tuesday until and including Tuesday, the 29<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1914. That during the whole time of said publication affiant was the secretary of The Anoka Herald Publishing Company, which was during said time, and still is, a corporation under the Laws of the State of Minnesota, and the proprietor, printer and publisher of said newspaper. That for more than one year prior to the commencement of said publication therein, said newspaper has been, and still is, a weekly newspaper, issued, printed and published on Tuesday of each week, in the English language, in column and sheet form, equivalent in space to more than four pages with five columns of at least seventeen and three-quarters inches length to each page, from a known office, established in such place of publication, equipped with skilled workmen and the necessary material for preparing and printing the same, and located and printed in the City of Anoka, County of Anoka and State of Minnesota, from whence it purported to be, was, and is, issued; and that during all said time it contained, and still contains, general and local news, comment and miscellany, not wholly duplicating any other publication, and not entirely made up of patents, plate matter and advertisements; and that during all said time it has been, and still is, circulated in and near its place of issue and publication to the extent of more than two hundred and forty copies, regularly delivered to paying subscribers. That on the Ninth day of August, 1911, the affidavit of R. P. Chase, Secretary of said corporation, publisher of said newspaper, was filed in the office of the County Auditor of said Anoka County, for the purpose of complying with Section 5516 of the Revised Laws, 1905.
